Come along to our free event and find out more about invasive species in the Upper Dove area and what you can do to help us control them or prevent further spread. The event will be focusing on the three main invasive plant species on the Dove - Himalayan balsam, Japanese knotweed and giant hogweed, as well as looking at non-native crayfish. We will be discussing:

- What we've achieved so far and future funding for dealing with Invasive species - there's opportunity to fund this work through the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme, so we really do need farmer and landowner support
 - Identification and recording where they are
 - Planned action for this year
 - An update on the Crayfish in Crisis project
 - Biosecurity measures to help stop the spread
